English Language Arts: 9th grade students take Intro to Literature & Composition or Honors Intro to Literature & Composition.

No application or recommendation is required to select the Honors class.

Social Studies: 9th grade students take World History 1 and 2, or Honors World History 1 and 2. No application or

recommendation is required to select the Honors class. A college-level textbook is used in the Honors

course, so students should be prepared to use this level of reading if choosing the Honors course.

Math: Please consult with your middle school math teacher for their suggestion for your next course.

Science: 9th grade students take Physical Science. Students who are taking Geometry or higher in the 9th grade

may request Biology instead if desired. Students who have already passed high school credit-bearing Biology and Geometry courses in middle school may request Chemistry or another science course.

Please refer to the Course Catalog for prerequisites.

World Language: World Language is not required for graduation. However, World Language is required for admission to

4-year colleges and universities (2 years minimum).

Instrumental Music: Symphonic Band: No audition required. Middle school band experience or instructor permission required.

Wind Ensemble: Audition required for incoming 9th grade students. Middle school band experience or

instructor permission required.

Jazz Band: Audition required. (This is an additional 7:45 a.m. before-school class. Concurrent

enrollment in a large ensemble class will be required)

Percussion: Middle school band experience or audition. Contact Mr. James. Chamber Orchestra: Audition required for incoming 9th grade students.

Symphonic Orchestra: No audition required. Middle school orchestra or instructor permission required.
